# Festival Celebrates 37 Years of Great Music, Family Fun and Harvests




Country music stars PARMALEE will perform their smash hits including "Carolina" on Sun., Oct. 11, 8:15 PM







Dirty Water will headline the Festival on Saturday, Oct. 10th. Dirty Water features drummer Sib Hashian and guitarist Barry Goudreau, former members of the band "Boston". They will be performing all the hits of Boston like "More Than a Feeling" Feeling", "Piece of Mind", "Foreplay/Long Time", "Rock and Roll", "Smokin'", "Don't Look Back", and "Amanda". The band sold 17 million copies of their self-titled debut album and seven million copies of "Don't Look Back", their second album.

Boston's self-titled debut album was released in 1976 on Epic Records. Helped by the singles "More Than a Feeling", "Foreplay/Long Time", and "Peace of Mind", the album peaked at number three on the Billboard chart and remained on the chart for 132 weeks. It went platinum 17 times in the United States and was the best-selling pop debut album in history.

"More Than a Feeling" peaked at number five on the Billboard Hot 100.

The band's second album, Don't Look Back, was released in 1978. It peaked at number one on the charts in both the US and Canada, and it went seven times platinum in the US. Its title track peaked at number four on the Billboard Hot 100.

In 1980 Goudreau recorded a solo record titled "Barry Goudreau" with Brad Delp his "Boston" band mate and brother-in law on vocals, as well as Fran Cosmo, who would go on to join "Boston" himself in 1991. Sib Hashian rounded out the lineup. The LP successfully hit the airwaves with the song "Dreams". In 1984, Goudreau would form the band "Orion the Hunter" with Fran Cosmo on vocals, and go on to work with Delp again in the band "RTZ" in 1991."

If you love Boston, this is the tribute show you for you. Come early and enjoy Tribute Day at the Festival on Oct. 10.

During a January 1998 interview, Aerosmith singer Steven Tyler singled out Draw The Line as the best of the Aerosmith tribute bands. On Boston's biggest Rock radio station 104.1 WBCN, disc jockey Nick Carter guoted "I've seen Draw The Line! They ARE Aerosmith!" The band is also popular on the college circuit as well and has been featured in articles in international fanzines and area newspapers.

They are the only tribute band who has been featured on the Official Aerosmith Website as well as that of Aerosmith's Official Fan Club. With support and accolades from Aerosmith themselves, as well as journalists, top DJs, and fans worldwide, its no wonder that Draw The Line is recognized as a oneof-a-kind. "A professional show band in a league of their own amongst tribute acts, and of a caliber that is unparalleled in the tribute genre" says reporter, Joe Reardon of the Mariner Newspaper Group.

The group's fanatical popularity was evident the evening of January 1, 1999, when it played at the former Mama Kins Music Hall in Boston in front of a sold out crowd of 800. Among other famous faces at that show was Steven Tyler's daughter, model Mia Tallarico. Steven Tyler quoted his daughter the next day as saying "Dad, have you seen this? From where I was standing, I couldn't believe how much they (Draw The Line) looked and sounded just like you!"

Draw The Line's lead singer, Neill Byrnes, won a Steven Tyler look-alike contest on 107.3 WAAF, another one of Boston's biggest rock radio stations. Even MTV agrees to the easily mistaken identity of Steven Tyler. So MTV invited Neill to fly to New York so they could film his magical impersonation for a promotional video. Even more recently Byrnes has been approached by VH1 to appear on their new

program, Rock Candy.





## **Country Stars Parmalee**

#### Sunday, Oct. 11, 8:15 PM - Hear their smash hit "Carolina."

From this tiny town in NC that's home to a gas station, two blinking yellow lights, and a small tinroofed barn dubbed Studio B, country rockers Parmalee launched their journey to Nashville. Each obstacle that delayed Parmalee's arrival to Nashville allowed Parmalee's country rock brand to develop. Their country rock sound has its roots in the bluegrass, traditional country, southern rock and blues covers the guys grew up hearing their families play. Matt and Scott Thomas grew up near Greenville, NC watching and playing in their father's popular southern rock blues band.

Barry Knox, loved what his cousins were doing and soon joined them. The line-up became the newly minted The Thomas Brothers Band. The band would often share the same marquee with a cover band that starred their friend Josh McSwain on guitar and keys, Matt invited Josh to play with them and the foursome clicked immediately on stage. From this moment in 2001, Parmalee was born.

The band rehearsed every Tues. & Thur. evening in the Parmele, NC barn they named Studio B. They added an extra "e" to the band's name to make it easier for those outside the area to pronounce it. Their musical journey took them all over the country including New York, Los Angeles, and Atlanta as they tried to find their music direction. All of the producers, managers, and record labels said the same thing: "you guys need to be in Nashville." The guys parked their RV, which doubled as their studio, in a Nashville parking lot writing new material and networking. Parmalee eventually went into the studio to record some sides, including "Carolina," and "Musta Had a Good Time." The President of BBR Music Group was impressed and asked to see a showcase as soon as the band returned to Nashville.

Parmalee put together a short tour in North Carolina to fund the trip back to Music City. After a Sept 2010 show two armed men knocked on the door of their RV. Shots were fired and Scott was shot three times. One bullet hit Scott's femoral artery causing him to nearly bleed to death and the doctor gave him a five percent chance to live." Scott was hospitalized in Charlotte for 35 days, 10 days in a coma. By February 2011, Scott was well enough to perform their label showcase. Through sheer willpower, the band nailed the set and landed a deal with Stoney Creek Records.

All of Parmalee's hard work and perseverance is paying off in a big way. Country fans voted the band's debut single, "Musta Had A Good Time," #1 for 4

consecutive weeks on SiriusXM's The Highway "and it became a Top-40 hit on mainstream country radio. Parmalee was named a "Bubbling Under Artist" by Billboard magazine and one of Clear Channel's NEW! Artists to Watch in 2013. Parmalee 2<sup>nd</sup> single, recently made history when the multi-week #1 smash "Carolina" became the longest climbing single by a duo or group in the 24-year history of the Billboard Country Airplay Chart. It was certified GOLD with over 500,000 in sales.

Parmalee's debut country album, FEELS LIKE CAROLINA, has earned critical praise. Parmalee has charted 4 singles off their debut album including their current single "Already Callin' You Mine" which is number 25 on the charts. Their third single, "Close Your Eyes" became their second consecutive Top 3 hit. Parmalee has been on Jake Owen's Days of Gold Tour and Brad Paisley's "Country Nation World Tour,"

### Festival History: 37 Years of Great Music, Fun & Harvests

Celebrating Teamwork, Cooperation, Community Spirit and Fun



#### It All Started in 1979

Deerfield Township Harvest Festival began in 1979. For a few people like Roy Spoltore, Tony Stanzione, Linda Ferrara and their friends and families, it has been where they have spent Columbus Day weekend for 36 straight festivals and other volunteers for more than 30 years. They are a loyal, committed group of people who have kept the festival together and guided its growth. There are children who grew up with the festival and now they are involved and their children are attending. It is a source of pride for this community, and one of Cumberland

County and South Jersey's most popular fall events.

It all began in the winter of 1979 when the late Dorothy Waechter. Deerfield Recreation Committee member and past Township Committee member suggested that the Township have another parade like the bicentennial parade in 1976. Tony Stanzione was a Township Committee member then and Roy Spoltore a recreation committeeman. They wanted to create a small version of block party. "The next thing we knew, it was the night before the festival in October 1979 and five or six of us were building floats, putting up signs, moving booths, and building a stage by putting two farm wagons together in the fire company picnic grove," said Stanzione. These volunteers included Dot Waechter, Tony's wife, Mary Jane, Roy's late wife, Patty and Linda Ferrara.

About 3,000 people got the message the first year beginning what is now a 36 year tradition that brings the community together, strengthens the townships identity and spreads the good news about living in the rural, farming town.

#### The 1980's

By October 1980, the festival grew to a two-day event and the hours were extended into the evening under the bright lights of the Frank LoBiondo, Sr. Park and the grounds of the Rosenhayn Fire Company. Entertainment included Capt. Bob, Give-And-Take Jugglers, US Army 8 Piece Band, The Serenaders Big Band, Banjo Dusters and the Mid-East Belly Dancers. The celebration included a dinner to honor local farmers, which was held the week before the festival. In 1981, the festival's reputation as a great place to have fun with family, neighbors and friends was spreading and the royalty pageant was added the week before the festival. It featured youngsters from Deerfield Township in the talent competition that lead to the selection of the harvest prince and princess. In



1983, Phillies former All-Star centerfielder Richie Ashburn served as grand marshal for the parade. In 1984, the Harvest Festival brought the Mahoney Brothers to the stage. This was a band that was popular along the entire East Coast for their tribute to the Beatles. The popular Philly Phanatic made his festival debut in 1984 and more than 8,000 people attended. In 1987, the festival attracted more than 10,000 visitors over its two days. In 1988, the festival welcomed nationally-known stars, The Drifters, The Box

Tops and The Shirelles on Saturday night billed as "Magic Moments from the 1960's." It was also the first year the popular Fabulous Greaseband performed. Attendance jumped to nearly 14,000 visitors.



The 1990's

1990, the festival honored area veterans. Popular rock music by an up-and-coming band was featured on Saturday night -- John Cafferty and the Beaver Brown Band. With the temperatures in the 80s and beautiful clear skies, mother-nature helped the festival attendance climb to an estimated 20,000 people over the three days. 1991 included a salute to area gulf war veterans. The Young Rascals, Orleans, the Grease band and the Red, White and Blue Band entertained festival crowds.

1994 put the spotlight on the young people of the area and honored Levin

Farms and the late Isaac Levin as farmer of the year. The traditional harvest festival parade was a highlight of Sunday afternoon. Entertainment included Johnny O

and the Classic Dogs of Love and the Exceptions. During the winter of 1994-1995, the Harvest Festival was temporarily discontinued due to liability issues raised by the Township Committee. After months of meetings, the festival was re-established without alcoholic beverages and with some other changes. It did not miss a year.

In 1998, Benny LaSala was farmer of the year and David Sharkey was teacher of the year. It featured two evenings of fireworks and the biggest crowd in the history of the festival to celebrate its 20th year. In 1999, Deerfield Township joined the rest of the world in celebrating the end of the 20th century. For the first time

in its history, rain threatened and dampened festivities as the festival moved into Sunday. 100 people of all ages gathered for the "picture of the century" after the parade.

### The 2000's

In 2001, planners of the festival revised its theme less than three weeks before the event after the terrorist attacks on America. Thousands joined in a candlelight ceremony just prior to the fireworks display on Sunday night, waving flags and singing "I'm Proud to Be an American." Southside Johnny & the Asbury Jukes entertained. In 2002, the festival faced difficult weather conditions, causing the cancellation of Friday's activities.

In 2003, the 25th celebration drew more than 25,000 people. Salute to rock, rhythm and blues included Charlie Thomas' Drifters, The Temptations Featuring Dennis Edwards, Grass Roots and Blood Sweat & Tears. 2005 is remembered for its nasty weather with idol contest judges under umbrellas and performers and audience members wet. On Saturday.

Rosenhayn suffered through seven inches of pouring rain. Ricochet came in from the rain to play an intimate, acoustical set inside Rosenhayn Fire

In 2006, rain delayed setup of the site and forced the idol contest on Friday night into the Rosenhayn Fire Hall. Better weather returned on Saturday and Sunday. Nationally-known performers included the Gin Blossoms, Emerson Drive and Ricochet. The 29th festival in 2007 honored America and featured nationally-known Country music bands Emerson Drive, Lady Antebellum and Starship featuring Mickey Thomas. One of the biggest crowds ever attended.



U.S. Armed Forces were honored and Lost Trailers, Gloriana, Whiskey Falls, Lee Brice and Danielle Peck performed. 2009 featured Bucky Covington, the Carter Twins, Patty Smyth & Scandal, Jessica Harp and more. Farm Heritage Awards recipients

were Frank and Dom Buono & families of Buono Farms, JV Sparacio, of Parkside Farms, and Frank and Josephine Paladino, of Paladino Farms.

In 2010, Darryl Worley who closed the festival on Sunday night, invited representatives of our armed forces and 1<sup>st</sup> responders onto the stage, to be recognized for their service to our country. Jason Michael Carroll and James Otto performed on Saturday night. The new jumbo high definition, LCD screen, known as "Fest-a-Vision" was introduced. Mother Nature provided a beautiful fall day and thousands joined in the celebration which ended with beautiful aerial fireworks display.
